22 For I delight [sunedomai - delight closely together with] in the law [nomos - law or principle] of God after [kata - according to] the inward man: 23 But I see another [heteros - another of a different kind] law [nomos - law or principle] in my members, warring [antistrateuomai - to mount a military campaign] against the law [nomos - law or principle] of my mind [nous - mind], and bringing me into captivity [aichmalotizo - one being captured and marched away under rule of another] to the law [nomos - law or principle] of sin [tes hamartias - the sin nature] which is in my members.

9 But as it is written, Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God has prepared for them that [are loving] love him. 10 But God has revealed them unto us by his Spirit: for the Spirit searches all things, yea [even], the deep things of God. 11 For what man knows [oida - know the facts] the things of a man, save the spirit of the man which is in him? even so the things of God knows no man, but the Spirit of God. 12 Now we have received, not the spirit of the world [kosmos - world system], but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given [charizomai - graciously given] to us by God.

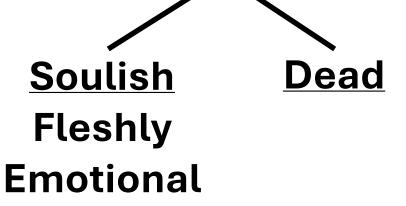
1 Corinthians 2:13-16

22 But the fruit [singular not plural] of [from] the Spirit is love [agape - to lay one's life down by doing what is best for another without regard to personal cost], joy [the appreciative acceptance of God's actions in our lives, even if they are not fun], peace [the calm state of mind regardless of circumstances], longsuffering [(The opposite of a short temper) it is the quality of mind that is not easily angered with people], gentleness [chrestotes - kindness - the easy-going attitude which puts others at ease, as opposed to being annoying and abrasive], goodness [the sense of well-being which is based upon God's work, which can be enjoyed despite circumstances], faith [a positive response to a promise from God, which makes the promise concrete so the individual can act upon it], 23 Meekness [(gentleness) - the tame attitude which maintains its focus on God's objective despite circumstances], temperance [enkrateia - self-control - the attitude which controls one's bodily appetites and needs so they do not interfere with doing God's will]: against such there is no law.

Romans 5:1-5

1 Therefore being justified [dikaioo - having been declared righteous] by [ek - out from as to source] faith, we have [are having continual] peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ: 2 By [dia through] whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice [kauchoamai - boast] in hope of the glory of [from] God. 3 And not only so, but we glory in tribulations [thlipsis many sided pressures that come due to life] also: knowing that tribulation works patience; 4 And patience, experience; and experience, hope: 5 And hope makes not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Spirit which is given unto us [the one that is given to us].

1 John 3:14-17

14 We know that we have passed from [the] death [thanatos separated, to put to death] unto [the] life [zoe - the animating principle of life], because we love the brethren. He that loves [agapao - sacrificing love] not his brother abides in death [thanatos - separated, to put to death]. 15 Whosoever hates his brother is a murderer: and you know that no murderer has eternal life abiding in him. 16 Hereby perceive [ginosko - to know in experience] we the love of God, because he laid down his life [psyche - soulish life] for us: and we ought to lay down our lives [psyche - soulish life] for the brethren. 17 But whosoever has this world's [kosmos - world system] good [bios - life, means of living on this earth], and sees his brother have need, and shuts his bowels of compassion from him, how dwells the love [agape] of God in him?

Colossians 1:9-10

9 For this cause we also, since the day we heard it, do not cease to pray for you, and to desire that you might be filled [pleroo - filled to the full (passive)] with the knowledge [epignosis - full experiential knowledge] of his will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; 10 That [in order that, for the purpose that] you might walk [peripateo order your life, take steps in] worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing [areskeia - pleasing] [in to all that is well pleasing], being fruitful [karpophoreo - bring forth] in every good work, and increasing [auxano - growing] in the knowledge [epignosos] of God;

Ephesians 2:8-10

8 For by grace are you saved [sozo - saved (perfect tense)] through faith; and that not of [ek - out from as to source] yourselves: it is the [a] gift of God: 9 Not of [ek - out from as to source] works, lest any man should boast. 10 For we are his workmanship [poiema - result of one's doing], created [ktizo - create out of nothing] in Christ Jesus unto good [agathos - good that desires the happiness of others] works, which God has before ordained [proetoimazo determined before] that we should walk in them.
